

Peer Review For 2-7-05

Read your paper one last time—**out loud**. If you hear something you want to change, **then draw one line** through your piece, put a caret (^) in, and write your change above your line.

When you're done with this, you **can** ask your readers questions about your piece, but you don't have to. The point of today's review is to simply hear "the voice" of your own work.

Some Possible Questions to Ask:

- What do you see as the "main idea" at the center of my paper?
- Did you get lost any place in my paper? Where?
- Are there questions that you have for me about the piece?
- What suggestions might you give me to help me with my next draft?

If you end early, then start redrafting your piece.
If you ended too early, then you didn't take
enough time reading your piece aloud, so read it
aloud again.
